What kinds of organizations are joining Industrial Internet Consortium?

Members of IIC represent a range of key industry, academia, and government sectors including but not limited to:

- Transportation

How are we organized?

The Industrial Internet Consortium is formed as a group under the Object Management Group, a nonprofit trade association as set out in section 501(c)(6) of the US Internal Revenue Code.

How is governance managed?

Who is represented in a working group?

Any and all members of the Industrial Internet Consortium can participate in a working group. Working groups are formed at the discretion of the Steering Committee when sufficient interest and leadership exists.

How much does it cost to become a member of Industrial Internet Consortium?

Fees for membership vary and depend on a number of factors. See the table below, and contact Ken Berk (ken.berk@omg.org) for more detailed information.

If we assign some staff members to work in a Working Group, where will they work, to whom will they report?

Members working in a working group may work anywhere they have access to a broadband internet connection. They will become integral elements of the process, where the working group lead will coordinate the development work.

How do I actually become a member?

It's quite simple. We have a formal process for IIC membership. It is designed to have barriers to entry, but it is also designed to ensure that all members execute the same agreements and are therefore all governed by the same rules.
